




Title

School Day of Peace and Nonviolence

Description

"You and I are one: I cannot hurt you without hurting myself". M. Gandhi



This commemorative date was born following the initiative of the Spanish poet, pedagogue and pacifist, Llorenç Vidal Vidal. Created in 1964, recognized by UNESCO in 1993, it intends to draw the attention of politicians, governors, parents, educators and teachers to the need for continuous training in non-violence and Peace; it is necessary to educate solidarity and respect for others "because wars begin in the minds of men, it is in the minds of men that the defenses of Peace must be built" (UNESCO Constitution, 1945).

The choice of January 30 is not by chance, but coincides with the anniversary of the murder of one of the greatest defenders of peace, non-violence, justice and tolerance: **Mahatma Gandhi.**

January 30th can therefore be an opportunity for you to publicly manifest your path/ development for peace and thus <u>Living Peace International</u> invites all its members to actively participate in this anniversary.

Target Audience

Children, youth and adults from schools, youth groups and associations.

Goals

- Reflect on the meaning of peace and ways to achieve it
- Reflect on the reasons for the existence of conflicts and how to resolve them
- Develop the concept of universal brotherhood
- Promote bonds of trust and reciprocity
