In Time for Peace – We are still on time for peace

Description

"To prevent the logic of war from being the law between people and peoples, let us be builders of peace now". Excerpt from the <u>Charter of commitment¹</u>

<u>Living Peace International</u>² proposes a path that involves different disciplines and unfolds in three areas of action: peace begins with me, peace in relation to others, peace and the community/world. This path can help to question and discuss the main causes of the ongoing conflicts, but it can also help to highlight the positive actions that are already implemented.

Recipients

Children, youth and adults, from different schools, groups and associations.

Targets

- Recognize that peace is the result of everyone's actions
- Recognize and highlight the "signs" of peace present in one's own context and in the world
- Recognize the factors that threaten peace in their own context and in the world
- Promote concrete actions in favor of peace
- Sensitize civil society to take on a lifestyle that promotes peace

Activities

1. Peace begins with me

- We launch the peace dice and share our peace actions; therefore we live the Golden Rule: "Do to others what you would like done to you".

- We research actions, events, people, associations, and organizations that have fostered and encouraged the promotion of peace and offer it to our community, in our neighborhood, for example through an artistic exhibition, a theater, a show ...

- We identify actions, events, people, associations, and organizations that in the cultural, historical and geographical context of our country have favored the promotion of peace; we choose a creative formula to represent this work (eg theater, exhibitions, festivals) <u>c.palma@livingpeaceinternational.org</u>

¹ The Charter of Commitment is a document and a tool that everyone can use to contribute to the achievement of the second of the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals (OSS) to be implemented by 2030: "Zero Hunger Objective". ² It is a path also conceived in collaboration with <u>Youth for a United World</u>.





2. Peace in relation to others



- We promote an action that involves us and the others: within our family and among our friends we collect toys, video games, CDs... etc that encourage violence and reconvert them creatively into instruments of peace! We decorate our spaces with these works of art and organize exhibitions.

- After having informed ourselves and studied the mechanisms underlying peace and war, we produce a song with a message of peace. Let us spread it on social media through a video writing **#livingpeaceinternational #intime4peace**

(N.B. use only images without faces for privacy).

3. Peace in relation to the community / world

- We take advantage of recurrences (eg September 21st - International Peace Day Celebration; January 30th Scholastic Day of Peace and Non-violence) and / or local events to spread our message, the Golden Rule and say "no tools of war". The run4unity - relay team can also be one of these occasions.
