Title Teddy Bear Hugs

Description

In the activity, children have the opportunity to donate teddy bears to children who are going through a difficult moment. You can deliver them to paediatric hospitals, orphanages, and in selected places in the Balkans, Greece, or the Middle East where a large number of war refugees live.

Donating a teddy bear that children can hug when they feel blue is a simple gesture that spreads peace and gives hope.

The idea was devised by the <u>Children of the Earth</u> organisation in 2004 with the goal of distributing teddy bears to young victims of the tsunami in Thailand. The project has since grown and has reached several places in the world such as Louisiana, Africa, Haiti, and the Middle East.

The activity is promoted by <u>Children of the Earth and Living Peace International</u>.

Target group

Children, youth and adults from any school, group, or association.

Goals

- Give hope and joy to children who are living in difficult conditions.
- Make children and kids aware of how difficult life is in certain places and encourage them to spread peace.
- Encourage kids to collect teddy bear where they live.

Activity

Collect teddy bears in your class or group.

Write a brief peace message and attach it to the bear you want to send to children who live in dire conditions in war-thorn Countries, or in hospitals or orphanages in your city or elsewhere. Check what <u>Campbell</u> did.

If you want that your gifts arrive in time of Christmas, mail it before the end of November.
